5. Dr. George Buttrick - at High School

in agony to set them right
words not deeds - Gospel is composed of

6. Thomson under - in one of his 3 minutes
play - tells of a man who one day stood
by the pool of Bethesda - waiting for the
water to be moved that he might be
healed
