We feel that putting Christ into our business would certainly mean cooperation - I would remind you that there is a vast difference in cooperation and operation (Bay & his trousers)

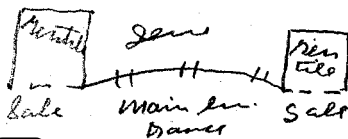
We hear a good deal to-day about free enterprise and the profit system - I like our way of life that enables a boy working under a section foreman to dream of one day being president of the Road.
