THE PRICE PAID FOR ALCOHOL

We are now living in an age when people, as never before, are counting the cost and asking the question, what is the cost? For some decades we have been acquainting ourselves with the cost of railroads, canals, levies the raising of stock, and various products, but until recent years we have been silent and ignorant as to price paid, financially, physically, mentally, and spiritually for the evils that prey uponus. We are now rising as it were from a stupor and our eyes are being opened, enabling us to see to some degree, at least, the price which we are paying for the evils that confront us.

There are so many evils that we are paying for that it is impossible for us to estimate them cost of all, therefore this discussion will be confined to the confined to the them.

This liquid monster is the greatest enemy of the human race, the burgular who steals the greatest amount of our finance, the murderer who kills the greatest number of human bodies, the anarchist who dethrones reason from the greatest number of minds, and the devil who destroys the greatest number of immortal souls.

The time has passed for guess work as to the effect of alcohol on any thing or anybody. Knowledge absolute and scientific, is saying yes to Bible questions three thousands years old and to human observation and experience as old as the human race. Its action on every part of the body has been thoroughly tested and the remarkable revelations stand undisputed by the thoughtful and unbiased millions of to-day.

This burgular crouches near our door and by a magic touch throws men and women, boys and girls into a delusion wherein they are caused to think that our financial conditions will suffer greatly if alcohol is done away. But man's reason directed by the hand of God, enlightened by the divine

Spirit, and developed by the best training is growing out of its narrow sphere into a higher realm where it no longer suffers delusion but where it sees in their true light the facts which convince beyond all reasonable doubt that alcohol does not help but destroys business. Statistics show us that in the states that are wet we find the greatest amount of powerty, the least number of homes owned by the occupants thereof, and the smallest number of dollars per capita. While on the other hand in dry states like Kansas we find far better business, better schools, larger bank deposits, and less poverty and crime. Where alcohol is we find more crime, more insanity, and of course more jails and insane asylums together with demands for money to support those institutions. In such places statistics show that where the city receives one dollar for license it pays out thirty eight for to support places for criminals and lunatics. On this basis it costs Cincinnati \$6000000 and the United States \$260000000 to run their saloons last year. Fifty per cent of the povverty of Germany and the same per cent of the hardship of England have been caused by alcohol.

The money spent annually for alcohol, if put in silver dollars and laid the one on top of the other, would make a column 2992 miles high. This pile of dollars would pay the expenses of the government for one year, and besides pay a pension to every soldier, and twennty dollars per month to every pperson over fifty years of age in our nation and at the same time provide for the education of every child from the ages of five to nineteen years.

In Calafornia during recent years four men have retired as millionaires because of the whiskey business. During this same time in poverty and shame II4000 men have filled drunkar@sgraves.

As an anarchist alcohol dethrones our reason and as a murderer kills our bodies. Our people are the losers, our people pay the price.

Each poison has a sellective affinity for a special part of the body.

Thus mercury first effects the salavary glands, strichnine the spinal cord, but alcohol selects the brain the most vital and important organ of the body.

The brain is composed of cells starlike and small, but by the microscope millions of them may be counted. These cells are connected by nerve fibers that transmit the brain impressions to the muscles and are collected in groups which are known as nerve centers. Each center has a special work to do. The condition of the nerve centers determine whether we will do our work well, indifferent, or not at all.

The brain cell centers have a definite order of growth. The unvarying rule of nature is, that the first to be created is the last to be destroyed, and the last to be created is the first to be injured or destroyed.

The first organ and nerve center of the brain to appear in the prethat natal infant, is the muscle of the heart and the brain center **** is to control it through life. The next organ to develop is the lungs. The third development is the nerve center that presides over voluntary muscular movements. every thousand babies are born \$\$\$\$\$\$ dead, and 69000 die annually in the first year of life.

Ny the above facts and figures we see that our nation as well as other nations is paying the price with human bodies yea more with human souls for this curse of the human race ____ alcohol.

This liquid fire is costing us the strength of our nation, for nonation is stronger than its manhood. Then too we might say that alcohol is costing us the beauty of our nation for no nation is fairer than its womanhood. We see every day its dreadful work. However, one years work of alcohol may be imperfectly outlined in the following lines: 5000 suicides, I0000 murders, 25000 smothered babies, 40000 widowed mothers, 60000 fallen girls, I00000 fallen boys, I00000 crimanals, and I00000 newly made drunkards graves. This remember is just one years work not to say any thing of the bad influence that went from these lives to others where the fruit will be reaped in coming years.

To make the above picture the more sad we only have to think of this fact: if the widows and orphans, made so by alcohol, were caused to stand side by side and hand they would belt the globe three times.
